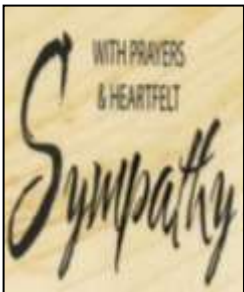

Medically Assisted Death and Challenges to a Good Death With the legalization of Medical Assistance in Dying, we are invited as Roman Catholic Christians to give serious consideration to what we believe about death and dying. The Church holds the underlying principle of Choose Life among all others. We recognize the question of medically assisted suicide is a multifaceted one with no easy answers and believe therefore it is important to have dialogue about this.

Dr. Nuala Kenny, as the past Ethics and Health Policy Advisor for the Catholic Health Alliance of Canada has been at the forefront of this conversation. In her book, *Rediscovering the Art of Dying* she addresses the ultimate medicalization of human suffering presented by medically assisted death, and expresses concern about society's increasing inability to accompany others toward a good death.

On Sunday, March 10th Dr. Kenny will be in our archdiocese to present on the impact of the legalization of Medical Assistance in Dying. As a medical doctor, medical ethicist, Professor Emeritus of Dalhousie University, Sister of Charity and author of over one hundred and eighty papers and four books, Dr. Kenny is nationally recognized as an educator and physician ethicist and travels extensively as a distinguished lecturer. We are delighted to welcome her for this workshop which will take place at St. Bernard's Church Hall, Botsford Street, from 2 to 8:30 p.m. Cost is \$15, which includes supper.

Who should celebrate this sacrament?

- ▶ Those who are elderly and whose frailty is becoming more pronounced
- ▶ Those adults and children who are suffering from a major illness. Illness comes in many different forms - physical, mental, psychological, emotional, and spiritual
- ▶ Those who are facing or recovering from surgery or serious medical tests
- ▶ Those suffering from a serious accident
- ▶ Those who suffer from chronic illness such as arthritis or diabetes
- ▶ Those who care for the sick, especially those who are closely bound in love to them

The English churches of the Moncton Diocese work together to offer this communal celebration two or three times a year. Join us on **Monday, February 11th at 11 AM for mass and the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to be held at St. Bernard's, 43 Botsford St, Moncton.
